

PARENT AND COMMUNITY CODE OF CONDUCT STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE

Date Issued: 2024

PURPOSE

The code of conduct provides families and visitors to St James with guidelines for professional and respectful behaviour, in a Christ-like way, towards all in our community.

SCRIPTURE

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things, there is no law. (Galatians 5:22-23)

RATIONALE

This document sets out the standards of conduct, and personal behaviour required of all who visit St James Primary School, to uphold and encourage a safe, supportive, productive, and harmonious community space. It is everyone's responsibility to uphold these standards including upholding the teachings and values of the Catholic Church and to avoid by words, actions or behaviours which are contrary to these teachings and values.

CONTEXT

St James Primary School is versed in the Play is the Way methodology. This means that we all abide by the language of the five life rafts and the scripture related to each, to ensure our behaviour is exemplary.

SCOPE

This Code of Conduct applies to all those who visit St James, inclusive of family members, and the broader community. It outlines the elements of engagement; communication, collaboration, and school culture, and the expectations and responsibilities of behaviour required to uphold the values, and integrity of our parish primary school to ensure all comply with the behaviours outlined within it.

FAMILY and COMMUNITY

The Family School Partnership domain in the Fullness of Life Framework, supports Catholic faith formation, learning and well-being of all students through authentic partnerships between schools, families and community. Authentic partnerships between families and schools are grounded in relationships where all feel cared for, respected, and valued.

Authentic partnerships are developed when relationships between home and school are based upon trust and ongoing, open dialogue. The connections between students, their families, schools, and our communities form the network of relationships in which young people learn. Substantial research evidence and current educational policy all point to the critical importance of renewed partnership efforts between families and schools. (*Fullness of Life Framework DLCSL*)

The following table emphasizes the importance of collaboration between schools, parents, and the wider community to ensure a safe and supportive environment for all students.

School staff are entitled to a safe work environment, indicating the importance of workplace safety and respect for educators. Parents and visitors are expected to communicate and behave respectfully while on school premises or attending school activities. This contributes to maintaining a positive and safe atmosphere for everyone involved.

Overall, this table underscores the collaborative effort required to create a conducive learning environment where students can thrive academically, emotionally, and socially.
